#### The Birth-Order Myth

(lines 1-4) "No wonder he's so charming and funny - he's the baby of the family!" "She works hard trying to please the boss. I bet she's a firstborn." "Anyone that selfish has to be an only child." It's long been part of *folk wisdom* that birth order strongly affects personality, intelligence, and achievement.

(lines 5-10) However, most of the research claiming that firstborns are radically different from other children has been discredited, and it now seems that any effects of birth order on intelligence or personality will likely be washed out by all the other influences in a person's life. In fact, the belief in the permanent impact of birth order, according to Toni Falbo, a social psychologist, "comes from the psychological theory that your personality is fixed by the time you are six. That assumption simply is incorrect."

(lines 11-14)The better, later, and larger studies are less likely to find birth order a useful predictor of anything. When two Swiss social scientists, Cecile E, and Jules A reviewed 1,500 studies a few years ago, they concluded that "birth—order differences in **personality...are** nonexistent in our sample. In particular, there is no evidence for a "firstborn personality."

(lines15-19) Of the early studies that seemed to show birth-order mattered, most failed to recognize how other factors could confuse the issue. Take family size: Plenty of surveys showed that eldest children were overrepresented among high achievers. However, that really says less about being a firstborn than about not having many siblings, or any at all. After all, any group of firstborns is going to include a disproportionate number of children from small families since every family has (lines 20-24) a firstborn, but fewer have a fourthborn. Most experts believe that position in the family means little when taken out of the context of everything going on in a particular household—whether sibling rivalry is encouraged or discouraged, for instance. Parents who believe that firstborns are more capable or deserving may treat them differently, thus setting up a self-fulfilling prophecy."
